Applying for Admission:

Presbyterian College reviews applications for transfer admission on a rolling basis. The sooner you submit your complete application, the sooner the Admission Committee can render a decision to you.

Transfer of Credit:

Your college transcripts serve as our primary source for a complete list of courses taken and courses in progress. The Registrar's Office will review your transcript(s) and determine which credits will transfer to PC. For dual enrolled credits while in high school, a college transcript must be submitted for review.

Please Note:

You must have a grade of C- or better for a course to be considered for transfer of credit.

Transfer credit may be granted for courses which correspond to or are the equivalent of courses offered by Presbyterian College.

Courses which do not correspond to courses offered by PC may be accepted as free electives.

Up to seventy-four (74) semester hours may be transferred.

Transfer students must complete the general education requirements that apply to the year in which they entered

Phi Theta Kappa:

Presbyterian College offers a Phi Theta Kappa scholarship for members of the organization. Students who are members of PTK and are admitted to PC will receive a \$2,000 PTK Scholarship in addition to any merit-based scholarships. Transfer students must be a member of PTK and provide proof membership on their application for admission to be eligible for the scholarship.

Transfer of Credit:

Presbyterian College offers merit-based scholarships to all students meeting satisfactory academic progress. Our merit scholarships range from \$20,000 to \$25,000.

In order to find out if you qualify for a merit-based scholarship, you are encouraged to submit your application. Once your application for admission is complete, your admission and scholarship status can be determined.

In addition to merit-based scholarships, you may also apply for need-based financial aid by submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
